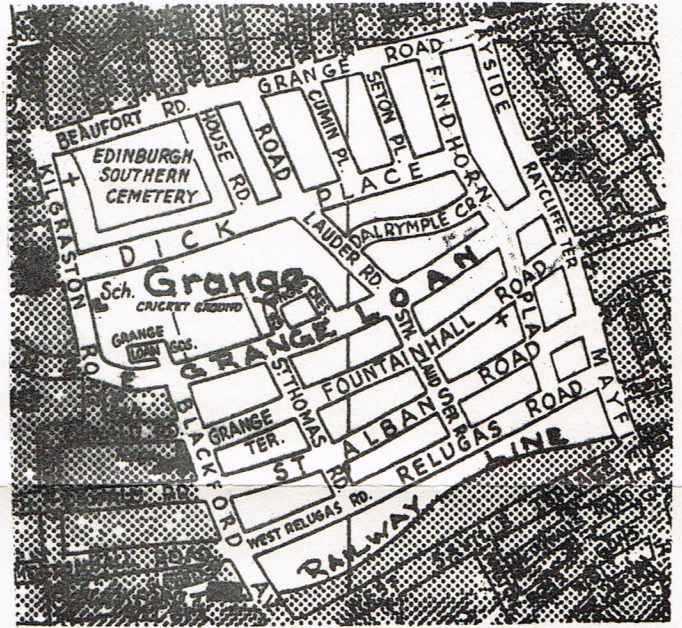
The Committee

Traffic Problems

The committee is aware that a majority of members attending the public meeting were particularly interested in problems raised by traffic in the area. The most immediate ones are those caused by the introduction of parking restrictions. The Corporation is reviewing the situation in October and the Association intends to make representation then. The committee would therefore be glad to have comments and ideas; these should be sent to the Secretary before the next committee meeting on 23rd September. Individuals are also urged to write direct to **The City Engineer's Department** with constructive criticisms and suggestions.

It is likely that a special working party will be set up to deal with longer term traffic problems; the east - west flow of traffic; environmental traffic management schemes; the parking of commercial vehicles and so on. May we have your views?
